WHAT IS SCYPE???

- A college-bound program for high school minority youth designed to reinforce and strengthen high school achievement in preparation for college attendance.
- A pre-collegiate chapter of the National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE) and the Rutgers University's Minority Engineering Educational Task (MEET)
- A partnership with Salem Community College with funding through the Community-Based Job Training federal grant program and other state and local sources.

HOW TO ENROLL???

- Minority youth who attend a high school in Salem County entering grades 9-12 in September 2009 are eligible for membership in SCYPE.
- Program materials and applications have been sent to middle and high school guidance counselors and principals, church pastors and youth leaders.
- Kickoff breakfast and program orientation on July 25, 2009 from 9:00 AM – 11:00 AM at the Edward W. Dorn Community Center in Pedricktown, NJ. Parents and participating youth will learn more about SCYPE and meet program officials, volunteers, partners and funders.
